Aims on the conference are:

- The interchange of experiences about village development in practice based on current issues and good examples;
- To make public the experiences of different European village movements in Germany and to discuss, how these experiences can be used in Germany.

How can villages, even if they are part of a larger municipality, keep their local identity? How can village communities address their own future on a democratic base by themselves? What is the potential of villages to improve the local living conditions by civic engagement? How can village protagonists pool their strengths to face the demographic change actively? How can the relation between village and municipality be optimized? These and other themes are to be discussed by domestic and international experiences.

Village movements have their main task in strengthening village communities with unfolding their potentials and exchanging experiences in regional and national networks. At the same time they act as a national - and via ERCA (European Rural Community Association), an international - village lobby.

ERCA is – just as the in ERCA united Village Movements – part of the civil society and political party independent. By the joint conference the Rosa-Luxemburg-Foundation wants to support ERCA's civil society concern to the best of its ability.

We are expecting conference participants, which are interested in international experiences on village development and may also present their own experiences,

- because they act as village chairmen or village mayors, members of village councils Ortsbeiräten, as persons in charge of village associations, as entrepreneurs or as protagonists in other rural spheres;
- because they bear responsibility for the development in villages as municipality mayors or by other functions in local politics;
- because they work in regional or nationwide associations, or networks, scientific, political and other institutions, which deal with village development.


